**Potential Acute Health effects:**

Hazardous in case of skin contact (irritant), of eye contact (irritant), Of ingestion, . Slightly hazardous in case of skin contact (sanitize, permeator). Non-corrosive for skin. Non-corrosive to the eyes. Non-corrosive for lungs.

The substance may be toxin to kidneys, liver, skin, central nervous system (CNS). Repeated or prolonged exposure to the substance can produce target organs damage.

### Section 4: First Aid Measures

**Eye Contact:**

Check for and remove any contact lenses. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Cold water may be used. Get Medical Attention.

**Skin Contact:**

In case of contact, immediately flush skin with plenty of water. Cover the irritated skin with an emollient. Remove contaminated clothing and shoes. Cold water may be used. Wash clothing before reuse. Thoroughly clean shoes before reuse. Get medical attention.

Highly flammable in presence of open flames and sparks, of heat. Flammable in presence of oxidizing materials. Non-flammable in presence of shocks

Slightly explosive in presence of open flames and sparks, of heat. Non-explosive in presence of shocks.

**Fire Fighting Media and Instructions:**

Flammable liquid, soluble or dispersed in water. SMALL FIRE: Use DRY chemical powder. LARGE FIRE: Use alcohol foam, water spray of fog.

**Special Remarks on Fire Hazards:**

Vapor may travel considerable distance to source of ignition and flash back. CAUTION: MAY BURN WITH NEAR INVISIBLE FLAME. Hydrogen peroxide sharply reduces the auto ignition temperature of Isopropyl alcohol. After a delay, Isopropyl alcohol ignites on contact with dioxgenyl tetrafluorborate, chromium trioxide and potassium tetra-butoxide. When heated to decomposition it emits acrid smoke and fumes. (Isopropyl alcohol)

**Special Remarks on Explosion Hazards:**

Secondary alcohols are readily autoxidized in contact with oxygen or air, forming ketones and hydrogen peroxide. It can become potentially explosive. It reacts with oxygen to form dangerously unstable peroxides which can concentrate and explode during distillation or evaporation. The presence of 2-butanone increases the reaction rate for peroxide formation. Explosive in the foam of vapor when exposed to heat or flame. May form explosive mixtures with air. Isopropyl alcohol + Phosgene forms isopropyl chloroformate and hydrogen chloride. In the presence of iron salts, thermal decomposition can occur, which in some cases can become explosive, A homogeneous mixture of concentrated peroxide + isopropyl alcohol are capable of detonation by shock or heat. Barium perchloride + isopropyl alcohol gives the highly explosive alkyl perchloride.

It forms explosive mixture with trinitormethane and hydrogen peroxide. It produces a violent explosive reaction when heated with aluminum isopropoxide + croton aldehyde. Mixture of isopropyl alcohol+ nitroform are explosive. (Isopropyl alcohol)

### Section 6: Accidental Release Measures

**Small Spill:**

Dilute with water and mop up, or absorb with as inlet dry material and place in an appropriate waste disposal container.

**Large Spill:**

Flammable Liquid. Keep away from heat. Keep away from source of ignition. Stop leak if without risk.

Absorb with DRY earth,

Sand or other non-combustible material. Do not touch spilled material. Prevent entry into sewers, basement or confined area: dike if needed. Be careful that the product is not present at a concentration level above TLV. Check TLV on the MSDS and with local authorities.

### Section 7: Handling and Storage

**Precautions:**

Keep away from heat. Keep away from sources of ignition. Ground all equipment containing material. Do not ingest. Do not breathe gas/fumes/vapor/spray. Wear suitable protective clothing. In case of insufficient ventilation, wear suitable respiratory equipment. If ingested, seek medical advice immediately and show the container or the label. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Keep away from incompatible such as oxidizing agents, acids.

**Storage:**

Store in a segregated and approved area. Keep container in a cool, well-ventilated area. Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use. Avoid all possible sources of ignition (spark or flame).

Reacts violently with hydrogen + palladium combination, nitroform, oleum, COCl<sub>2</sub>, aluminum triisopropoxide, oxidants incompatible with acetaldehyde, chlorine, ethylene oxide, isocyanates, acids, alkaline earth, alkali metals, caustics, amines, crotonaldehyde, phosgene, ammonia. Isopropyl Alcohol reacts with metallic aluminum at high temperatures. Isopropyl Alcohol attacks some plastics, rubbers and coatings. Vigorous reaction with sodium dichromate + sulfuric acid. (Isopropyl Alcohol)
